KS3 Reading Schools Programme: Building a Culture of Reading

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About the programme

The highly successful *Reading Schools Programme: Building a Culture of Reading* is aligned to the National Curriculum, the Reading Framework (DfE, 2021), and the Education Endowment Foundation (EEF) school implementation process.

The blended programme builds the skills of English department staff and librarians to enable sustained school development in Reading for Pleasure (RfP). It combines research evidence, rigour and tailored support.

This is a unique opportunity to develop wider staff knowledge and practice for RfP that impacts upon all KS3 students.

Core features

- Evidence-informed, highly practical and collaborative.
- Baseline data collection and analysis (KS3 surveys, reviews and more).
- A focus on the impact on pupils' engagement and attainment in reading.
- Bespoke support and coaching for programme leaders (7 sessions and 4 tutorials online)
- Wider staff/interdepartmental training (CPD conference).
- SLT and Implementation Team sessions.
- Dedicated website and RfP school improvement case studies.
- KS3 Book Box and core professional text.

Cost

£2,400 per school. Cost includes online conference for wider staff, led by the OU team.

Additional fee for face-to-face conference TBA.

Total includes 35 hours of OU contact, including coaching support, book box and resources to implement the programme.

Key features

- The development of an Implementation Team to drive analysis and action. This includes representatives from selected subject departments, including English.
- Year-long cycle of support. This includes **exploring** baseline data (staff and pupils), auditing and understanding the evidence; **preparing** for change and identifying aims; **delivering** change, implementing and monitoring; **evaluating** and measuring impact; **sustaining** and embedding.
- Coaching conversations. These are used as tools for reflection, evaluation and building reading leadership capacity, influence and impact.
